Modesto City Schools and Beyer High School set dress code standards that promote a safe and effective learning environment for all students.

The following are **NOT PERMITTED**:

- ⊙ Low-cut, bare-midriff tops/dresses
- ⊙ Strapless or backless tops/dresses
- ⊙ Short shorts – NO visible body parts
- ⊙ Skirts/Dresses shorter than mid-thigh
- ⊙ Visible undergarments
- ⊙ Clothing or accessories promoting alcohol, tobacco, drugs, discrimination, violence or sexually suggestive (i.e.- “I ♥ Boobies”, Cookies)
- ⊙ Red or blue shoelaces that are not part of the manufacturer’s package, this includes but is not limited to all shades in the Red or Blue families.
- ⊙ Gang associated dress as determined by MCS and local law enforcement agencies
- ⊙ No pants or shorts may be worn below the waist, sagging to the point where undergarments or skin can be seen. Oversized pants must be cinched at the waist by a belt, or be appropriately sized to rest on the waist.

In addition to the MCS Board approved dress code, the Beyer High School Safety Committee has adopted site-specific regulations.

- ⊙ Students should have their Identification Cards with them at all times. Identification Cards are needed for proper student identification and for library use.
- ⊙ NO scooters or skateboards carried on campus. Scooter or skateboards may be left in the Intervention Center.
- ⊙ NO hoverboards
- ⊙ NO Hats or bandanas on campus. (During inclement weather, dates determined by Assistant Principal) students will be allowed to wear knit, solid-colored (white, grey or black) caps free of symbols, designs and bills. In addition, students may wear the school spirit knit cap sold in the SBO. Knit caps are only allowed outdoors during the approved time period.
- ⊙ NO spaghetti strap tops/dresses
- ⊙ NO extra-long t-shirts, shorts and long white tube socks pulled up
- ⊙ NO Red or Blue rosaries. (Other colored rosaries should not be visible- i.e. tucked into shirt.)
- ⊙ NO more than two red or two blue articles of clothing and/or accessories (unless red, white and blue is combined for school spirit)
- ⊙ NO “Stars and Straps,” “South Pole,” “North Pole,” “Cookies,” 3 and 5 point crown, and all black clothing.
- ⊙ NO “Cali” attire (Red NIA, Red Star, NorCal, SoCal), Sacramento Kings, Chicago Bulls, Area Code, Last Kings or other gang related geographical references
- ⊙ NO clothing with inappropriate abbreviations such as M.O.B., Marilyn Monroe Shirt (depicting inappropriate attire, tattoos, rose bud, bandanas, guns, and etcetera)
- ⊙ No key chains of a dangerous nature or wallet chains.

Cell phones and all other electronic devices (iPods, tablets, mp3 players, personal gaming devices, ear buds, etc.) are to be **SILENCED and NOT VISIBLE** during class hours unless otherwise allowed by the teacher. **Students using their cell phones in hallways or restrooms during class time may be subject to disciplinary action. If an electronic device is used in violation of the teacher’s policy or direct request, it will be TURNED IN to D-36 for retrieval after school in accordance to the conduct code.** The students will receive a referral with associated consequences for each violation. Parent to pick up the electronic device may be required. Students may use these devices during passing period, lunch, before school, and after school. A student videotaping a fight is interfering with campus safety. Posting the fight on social media also creates campus disruption. **A student engaged in either activity is subject to disciplinary action and may be home suspended. Videotaping students or staff, during school hours, is strictly prohibited.**
